VINUM AUTMUNDIS



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Located at Germany's smallest wine region, Vinum Autmundis, is a cooperative in the town of Gross-Umstadt, it is also called the "wine island".

Not that small - at least by German standards - is the production of Vinum Autmundis, nor is the high quality standard it hold itself to.

Oliver Schröbel, Managing Director of Vinum Autmundis, worked at the famous Henkell winery earlier in his career and is a committed advocate to the region.

The vineyards are located on the slopes of the Odenwald Forest. The climate here is mild and spring is known to arrive here first - ahead other regions in Germany. The Romans observed this fact almost 2,000 years ago, started growing vines in Gross-Umstadt - and named it "Autmundis"!

Vinum Autmundis' strength are certainly the fruit-forward Rieslings and Pinot Blanc displaying an elegant and balanced style with pleasant, mineral notes.
